Perth Field Rifle Club: Club Rules

On The Range

- All shooters and spectators will be under the supervision of a range officer and will not commence loading or firing until the words of command are given by the range officer.
- No rifle on the range is to have the breech closed when not actually being used. Penalties can be imposed.
- No person shall sit behind or sight through any firearm under any circumstances until the all-clear bell has been sounded.
- Firing, unless authorised by the range officer, shall only be at targets properly attached to the target frames. Shooting at unauthorised targets is not allowed.
- 5 Firearms must be cleared by the Range Officer or a Safety Officer before leaving the firing point.
- In the event of any malfunction of a firearm on the firing point, the member involved must raise his\her hand in the air to attract the attention of the Range Officer, who will then either clear the firearm for removal from the firing point, or supervise correction of the malfunction, provided it can be done quickly and with a minimum of disturbance to the other shooters.
- Should a target tear or shift and the shooter desires to replace the target, he or she will attract the attention of the Range Officer, who will stop firing, clear all firearms, and then nominate a person not immediately engaged in firing, to move down to the target area and correct the target involved.
- 8 No firearm will be raised above or to either side of the target area.
- There will be no person's other than the Range Officer, instructors approved by the Range Officer and those immediately engaged in firing, on the firing point itself.

Perth Field Rifle Club: Club Rules

- The Range Officer shall be any person nominated by the Club Captain or Discipline Delegate.
- 11 Red Safety flags will be flown at specified points before any firing commences.
- The attendant's book is to be signed by all members and visitors, and appropriate range fees paid, immediately on arrival at the range.
- Adequate footwear you will be worn at all times on the range, Thongs are **NOT** sufficient.
- No individual shall be permitted to demonstrate load or fire any firearm on Perth Field Rifle Club property after consuming alcohol or drugs.

 The Club Captain and\or President shall be the ultimate authority in determination all of this regulation and club safety.
- All firearms on the range must be held all carried in such a way that it is evident they are in a safe condition. No rifle is to be carried cased.

 Muzzles must be pointed in a safe direction at all times.
- 17 Pistols can be carried directly to a rigging area in a case or bag, where thereafter they will be carried in a holster.
- No loaded magazines can be carried on a person unless under supervision of the Range Officer.
- All animals shall be restrained in the car park or gazetted area.
- Any person not being a member of Perth Field Rifle Club can shoot as a visitor to the Club a maximum of three times per calendar year, unless specifically invited by the delegate.
- When shooting handguns, all persons on the line and in the vicinity must wear safety glasses.
